By the time you read this, we will probably have already arrived in Bolivia. This is always a hectic time, and although we are excited about returning to Bolivia, it seems like saying goodbye has gotten more difficult each time. Before, we were all leaving as a family and saying goodbye to parents, and while that was hard enough, we are now saying goodbye to our kids, and especially our granddaughter Althea. With social media, it is much easier to stay connected than before, but it is hard not to think about the things we will miss, like first steps, birthdays, holidays, etc. If there is one thing that has stood out during these twenty years on the mission field, it is that time doesn't stand still and that as time passes, things change and people change. We realize that this is part of being a missionary and that it is a great sacrifice to serve the Lord, but it is a sacrifice that is worth it. I can honestly say that I have never regretted my decision to sacrifice all and serve the Lord, and I can say that He is worth it and that He deserves even more. The Lord paid the ultimate price for us and sacrificed all so that we could have life and now take the same message to others. So, although serving the Lord and even living for the Lord can require sacrifice, I can promise you that you will never regret it, and He is truly worthy.

Wrapping Up:

Coming down to the end of our furlough is always so crazy because we have to get everything finalized and tie up all loose ends before heading out. We were able to get all of our things packed, moved, and stored in our storage building, all of our utilities and services canceled, which includes lights, water, internet, phone service, and much more. We have also been able to set up and make arrangements for our arrival to Bolivia, like plane tickets, a place to stay the first few days, the house that we will be renting, and plans to move all of our things and get the house set up. You can imagine why things seem to be just a blur these last couple of weeks. We were also able to finish up our last couple of meetings and spend those last two weeks with our family before leaving. Pray that we can have a smooth transition and get settled as soon as possible.

Inside Enemy Territory:

As the day approaches to leave, we are both excited but concerned because of the current situation in Bolivia. They have currently had close to forty days of strikes and blockades because the former president has an arrest warrant, and he has sent his people out to try and overthrow the government. This has resulted in a lack of meat, gasoline, and medical supplies. We are praying that things will be resolved quickly, but until they are, we will be back on the battlefield behind enemy lines. So please pray for us and Bolivia.
