We have Arrived:

We praise the Lord that we made it back to Bolivia on June 16th. This trip was a little different because we used a different airline and route to arrive. We left Raleigh, NC on Monday afternoon and arrived in Cochabamba on Tuesday morning. We are thankful to the Lord that everything went smoothly and all of our flights were on time. We also had no problems in immigration or customs, which is a great blessing. We were especially worried about our flight within Bolivia because of all the blockades we were having. We had heard that most flights were leaving 3-4 hours late and many were even canceled. Although the line to check in was extremely long in Santa Cruz, we were able to make it and we arrived to Cochabamba on time. We were able to make arrangements for our new house before leaving for Bolivia, but we started out in an Airbnb and on Thursday we moved all of our things to the house and began unpacking. I think we were able to get most everything set up the first week or two, which is probably a record for us. Like we mentioned in our last prayer letter, it is always hard to leave family and friends, but we are excited to be back and thankful for the Lord's blessings.

Getting Adjusted:

Although you might not know it, going back and forth between living in Bolivia and the US takes some adjusting, in different areas. Although we are more and more accustomed to the Bolivian culture, it still takes a little while to readjust after living in the US for a year. This is where the stress and frustrations can come from and even feeling down and depressed. This time back, the culture has not been as hard to adjust to as the physical adjustment has been. We have struggled physically with the altitude (8700ft) and especially getting adjusted to the difference in food. There was also the added stress this time because with the strikes and blockades, there had been very little meat and almost no gasoline for cars. This meant waiting in line hours or even days to get gas. We praise the Lord that since we arrived, the blockades have been lifted and things are returning to normal little by little, and we are adjusting little by little. Thanks for your prayers.

Hitting the Ground Running:

This time arriving, we have really hit the ground running and have been exceptionally busy. Both Beth and I have had meetings almost daily with the different pastors and people from different ministries, along with being back to serving in and visiting the churches. We are also planning for our upcoming youth conference and dividing the responsibilities. It has been a little tiring, but we are enjoying being back in the work of the Lord.

2. Pray for us physically, mentally, and spiritually as we adjust to being back in Bolivia.
